STAR Girls joins a mentorship approach with local policy experimentations to support **gender representation** in a male-dominated sector.



Women constitute only about 30% of the workforce in the Clean and Renewable Sector.

We are five countries with an EU-driven approach

STAR Girls is a consortium of EU countries, encompassing VET centres, academic and research institutions, policy makers, industry players and social and civil organisations from **Greece, Portugal, Spain, Italy and Netherlands.**

Our Action is inserted in three pillars

Mentoring and Role Models – 100 mentors are trained to guide young women mentees in the renewable energy realm.

Policy Experimentation – 100 mentees test the impact of STAR Girls mentoring programme.

Stakeholder Engagement – 150 industry players, VET community, policy makers and advocates collaborate for a **cultural and structural shift.**
